As an auditioning Choir this keeps the standard of singing within the Choir very high. We have a strong tradition of singing with professional soloists and we also have similar high standards for our orchestral and keyboard accompanists.



Derby Bach Choir was formed early in 1959 by Wallace Ross, who was Master of Music at Derby Cathedral. He led the Choir for more than 30 years, until in 1991 the baton was passed to John York Skinner following his career as an internationally renowned counter-tenor.

Richard Roddis, one of the finest choral conductors in the Midlands, became our Musical Director in 1999 and has since then conducted all of our major concerts.

As might be expected, Derby Bach Choir has a focus on Bach, but under Richard Roddis we have continued to expand our repertoire, performing many other great works. Recent concerts have spanned a range of choral works from Monteverdi to Jonathan Dove.

Mozart's mass in C minor, also known as "The Great Mass", is considered one of his greatest works. He wrote it for Constanza, and it is likely that she sang the highlying first soprano part.

Puccini composed his Messa di Gloria when he was only eighteen but it was performed only once during his lifetime. It was intended as a farewell to his association with sacred music. Comprising the usual mass sections (Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus and Benedictus, and Angus Dei), it is uncomplicated, direct and unashamedly operatic. A remarkably assured work for an eighteen-year-old, it is full of colour, vitality and musical surprises.

Haydn's *Missa in tempore belli (Mass in time of war)* is so called because it was written in 1796/97 as Napoleon's forces were advancing towards Vienna. In German-speaking countries it is often referred to as the *Paukenmesse* (Timpani Mass) – the timpani play a significant part in the mass, especially in the Angus Dei where it heightens the intensity of the movement's prayer for mercy and peace.

Kodaly's *Missa Brevis* was written during the Second World War in 1945, when Red Army troops finally overcame the German forces who had been occupying Budapest. Kodaly, taking refuge in the cellar of the Budapest Opera House, reworked his purely instrumental *Organ Mass* of 1942 to create the *Missa Brevis*, which then had its first performance in the cloakroom of the Opera House.
